ONE MAMA LAUNCHES FIRST MEDICAL CLINIC IN UGANDA

San Francisco, CA, May 20, 2008 – The OneMama organization plans to build its first medical clinic in Uganda with help from the Bay Area community. Tactics of Hope has officially endorsed OneMama as an exemplary model of social entrepreneurship, and through the support of local business and community, OneMama has seen overwhelming generosity.

This July, founder Siobhan Neilland, plans to travel back to Uganda to develop a medical clinic for the communities, which originally inspired her to build the OneMama organization. A year in development, OneMama has finally been able to gain momentum in working towards its goal to empower sustainability in rural communities. Earlier this month, OneMama was able to raise 10,000 dollars through its launch party fundraising event. Large local companies participated in match programs and donations, and local bands donated their time to create a night of magical giving.
